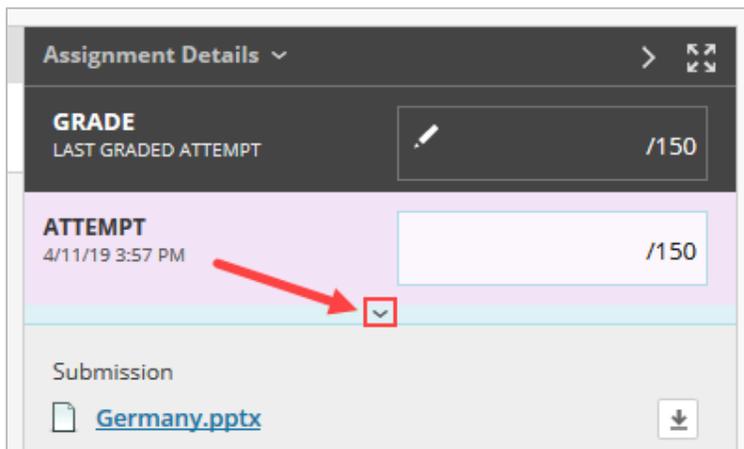


USING RUBRICS FOR GRADING

Most online master courses provide built-in grading rubrics for graded activities. If these rubrics are in your course, you are expected to use them to grade students and give feedback. This user guide explains how to grade an assessment with a rubric if one is provided.

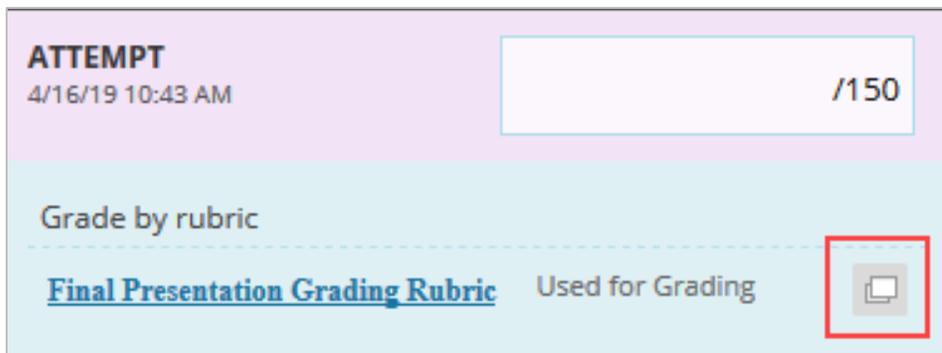
1. In the grading area, click the down arrow to expand the **Assignment Details**.

- Click the box for the level of achievement that you choose based on your evaluation of the student's submission. Complete this for each category listed on the left.

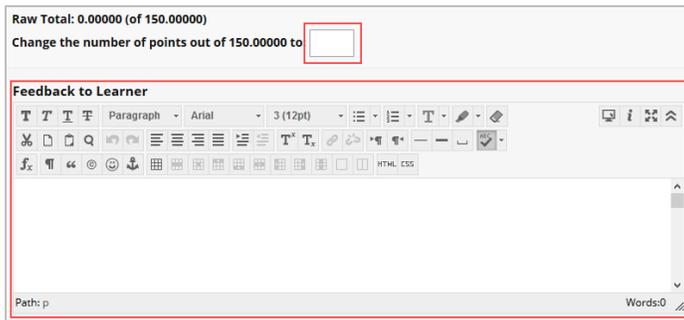

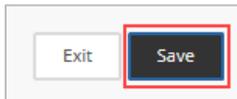
5. You have the option to change the total points. Provide overall personalized feedback, pointing out what the student did well and what they can improve on.



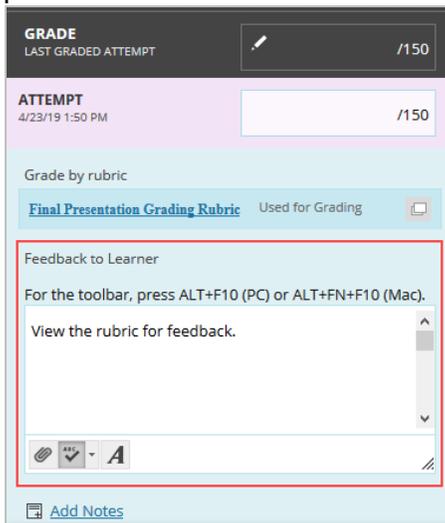
Note:
